| Education Activities Reports | EMT Class (Chris) –Started with 31 students. There are 23 remaining. Numbers are consistent with last semester. Paramedic Class (Kourtney/Connie) – Students are doing well. Phase 2 meetings projected to start after 20 May. Preceptors should be identifying any students who need additional calls. Connie discussed that there were difficulties meeting full time hours at Harper for veterans using the GI bills, so program hours were increased to 39 hours. The increase in hours should help with veteran reimbursement. Connie noted the yearly report and resubmission of CoA accreditation were due in May. Pretesting for the fall paramedic class has started. A new student competency matrix will be implemented with the fall class. Finally, there are guest seats approved for licensed paramedics who wish to challenge the NREMT exam and practicals. CE Reports – (Kourtney): Spring was psych quarter. The quarter went ok, and questions were answered about decision making capacity and the management of behavioral health calls in the new petition-less time. Moving forward, CE topics will change, and topics will be moved more frequently. The concept of building on previous CE and checks for understanding will continue. System Entry testing and Peer Educator credentialing (Connie): Going well. Bill is reviewing packets prior to SE. The groups are smaller ECRN class report (Connie): Will be running a hybrid course. Dates TBD TNS class report (Connie): TNS will also use a hybrid course. Lutheran General, McHenry, and NCH are host the Fall course. | | Chief's meeting: no report PBPI – Stroke screen is coming in July. Focus will be what community the patient was located and which stroke center the patient was brought to by EMS. This project will align with the American Heart Association's Get with the Guidelines Stroke recommendations. Cardiac arrest data drove the changes in the upcoming SOP changes. Concerns about how the system is doing with cardiac arrest management. At the highest point, NWS had the best outcome data in nation but there has been a | |

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| | steady decline since that time. Concern areas: LUCAS Device use. AHA does not recommend use of the mechanical CPR devices but NWS will continue to use. Apox will decrease to 3 minutes in select patient populations. Early defibrillation if the patient is found in a shockable rhythm regardless of EtCO2. The new cardiac SOPs will follow the AHA guidelines. CARS – (no rep): Went live with PCR into EPIC last Monday with Buffalo Grove, Mount Prospect and Prospect Heights. The key is accuracy with patient names, addresses, dates of birth, etc. Still looking for 100% reconciliation between PCR and hospital EMR. Validity rules: pursuing local validity rules rather than Region 8, 9, & 10 consortium). If approved, Jim Klein will be able to set validity rules. R & D (Jeanine Liska) – Connie reported that the committee is looking at what projects are still pending. Ultrasound project from Hoffman is pending (issues with the time off the chest during CPR). Meeting again tomorrow. |
