Introductions	 Kimberly Gaeding – Palatine Rural FPD Zack Lane – Palatine FD
Education Committee Meeting	• Monthly CE Review - Just like Heart Attack and Stroke, there are efforts in place for Public Education on Sepsis recognition. There was discussion and it was stressed that I/O placement should be included as an alternate site placement. More training beyond discussion on establishing I/O's on conscious patients. More obstetrics CE is planned.
	• ECG Assessment – The results of the needs assessment from October 2017 were discussed. There were 100 that chose to remain anonymous on their personal results. The System mean average was 70.3%. There was a significant number of 50% and lower scores. Work will be done to inprove the overall ability to identify rhythms.
	November SOP's – The new SOP's will have new color coding, easier to read, and more user friendly.
System and State Updates	 The State has scheduled additional meetings. More Education Programs need to move to the National Registry level. Over one-half are accredited or are under a Letter of Review. Many programs are still sending students to the State Exam instead of the National Registry Exam. Springfield – On-line data base now back operational for EMS licensing.
	 Scope of Pratice – Updates and final draft was out in the spring. New National Scope of Practice will be in September 2018 Education Rules were adopted in July. New Policies will be coming to the System. The Policies will reflect title changes. EMT-B will become <i>EMT</i>; EMT-P will become <i>Paramedic</i>.
	 There will be a Q & A secession on Illinois testing. State Medical Directors are on-board for NREMT. There are Lead Instructor classes scheduled for November 2018 in Joilet and Belvidere.
	 Designated Infection Control Officer classes are scheduled for February 2019.
	Classes - The original 65 EMT students is now 58. Paramedic has 29 students. TNS has 33 students.
	MIH – Contracts have been approved. Palatine FD has been approved; waiting for Palatine Rural and Rolling Meadows. Springfield has approved contractual agreements.
	• King Vision – System training completed in July 2018. There will be a new System video posted. Success rates prior were 83-84%; now 95%. The current Bougie fits a 6.0 tube; the small pediatric Bougie will fit a 4.0 tube; all will be looked into.
	Rescue Airway Device - Averaging 88% success rate; findings will be looked into. A pediactric device is being researched.
	 Cardiac Arrest Committee - Now looking at the <i>Event</i> buttons and how they can aid with documentation. CARES Registry - Cardiac Arrest docdumentation being looked at and how it compares to State and Nation-wide statistics.
	There are still some documentation discrepencies. Dispatchers have an integeral role in the overall process. Length of pauses in CPR still a concern seen. Dr. Jordan always available for feedback issues.
	Fentanyl shortages continue. IV solution shortages are improving.
Next Meeting	 It was noted that IV success rates are low. Successful starts where j-loops are used need to be capped with a Saline Lock. Next meeting will be November 6, 2018.
Adjournment	 January 2019's meeting will fall on January 1st. The suggestion is to move the meeting to the second Tuesday, January 8th. Reserving a room will be requested.
