RE: Updated masking guidelines

The numbers of those ill with colds, influenza, RSV, and Covid-19 are decreasing. There are concerns for increasing cases of measles and tuberculosis.

Based on that, we are amending our guidelines related to masking effective immediately:

## **EMS Guidelines**

- Masks are optional for patients, persons who accompany them in an ambulance, and EMS personnel with the following exceptions:
  - Wear a medical grade mask when caring for immunocompromised persons and use good judgement for masking around other vulnerable patients.
  - Medical grade masks must be worn by patients presenting with S&S of a cold, flu, Covid-19, RSV, or tuberculosis. EMS personnel shall wear a well-fitting medical grade mask (or N95 prn) when caring for persons with respiratory symptoms.
  - Patient presenting with fever and rash need to be masked and promptly isolated upon hospital arrival in conformity to Measles guidelines previously sent.
  - Respect patients' wishes when they ask you to mask.
- Please stay home when you are experiencing cold or flu symptoms. Do not care
  for patients while ill. Report any fever and/or S&S of respiratory illness or infection per
  employer/student guidelines.
- Use excellent hand hygiene and respiratory etiquette in all situations.

We will continue to monitor regional trends and provide further updates as needed.

and each other safe.
