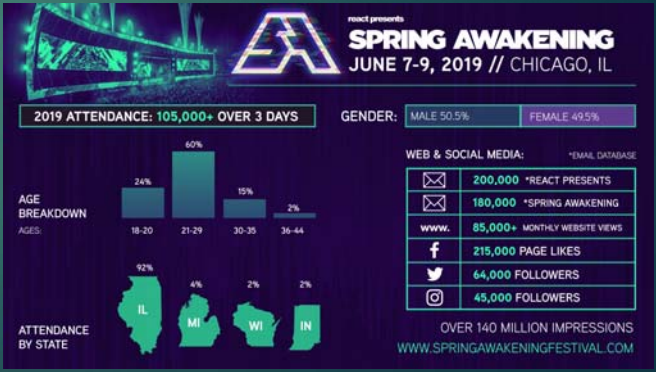




Event Basics

- ▶ Three Day EDM/Rave Event at Sears Center
- ▶ June 7-9, 1p-10p each day
- ▶ 18 y/o minimum age entry
- ▶ Ticket estimates currently sold
 - Fri June 7 20,000
 - Sat June 8 27,000
 - Sun June 9 27,000
- ▶ Hard close at 10pm



Parking & Transportation

- ▶ Large geographic area for ride share and pickup
- ▶ Includes buses, personal vehicles, Lyft, Uber
- ▶ Expect most patrons will head back to City after Event Close for "After parties"

Buses will transport to public transit sites

- ▶ Barrington Metra Station
- ▶ Rosemont CTA Blue Line




Housing


EMS Delivery of Care

Hoffman Estates FD providing EMS to:

- ▶ Grounds of Sears Center but not inside Event
- ▶ Village of Hoffman Estates

Event Medical Solutions

- ▶ Inside Event
- ▶ Medical tents staffed by physicians, nurses, paramedics

On Site Medical Specifics

3 First Aid Locations
One Medical Tent

- ▶ EM physicians, staffed with 1-2 each day
- ▶ Care ranges from BLS to ALS
- ▶ Most care supportive: hydration, anti-emetics, wound care, cooling
- ▶ Critically Ill pts will NOT remain on site
- ▶ Uncooperative/agitated pts will NOT remain on site

Med Tent Goal:
Provide care that prevents ED evaluation

Transportation Officers

Two different Transportation Officers will be on-site

- ▶ Event Medical Team officers
- ▶ Hoffman Estates Transportation officer

Goal: Coordinate transports off site
and prevent hospital overload

Both will be located next to each other at Event


Both teams will be contacting hospitals at start and
during event to gauge volume, capability, and oversaturation

Medical coverage Outside Event

- ▶ HEFD has upstaffed for entire weekend
- ▶ Includes presence at Event but mainly for the Village
- ▶ HEFD will move pts outside of but in vicinity of Event to the Medical Tent as a treatment center
- ▶ All pts transported by HEFD to hospitals will be business as usual
- ▶ Mutual Aid as per normal policy will be performed by surrounding Suburbs
- ▶ MABAS 1 division is also aware and available

Hospital Participation

- ▶ Currently 6 area hospitals slated to receive pts: SAMC, ABMC, NCH, AGSH, STJE, Sherman
- ▶ SAMC will be most affected due to proximity
- ▶ SAMC will be taking critically ill when possible
- ▶ Goal: disperse pt volume equally to area hospitals
- ▶ If needed will expand transport to all Region 9 facilities



Methods of Transport

Event Medical will provide 9 private ambulances

- ▶ Lifeline, Event Medical, A-Tec all ALS capable
- ▶ If needed, with use of Superior can flex to up to 40 amb
- ▶ PPERS of metro Chicago also available for support

Event Medical paramedics function in Region 11

Radio Communication will be a 2 step process

- ▶ First call to Region 11 hospital (likely Northwestern) for OLMC
- ▶ Second call to receiving hospital by EMS as a pre-arrival courtesy not for OLMC



Anticipated Pt numbers to Hospitals

- ▶ Hope to keep transports to <30/day to area hospitals (combined)
- ▶ Similar events w/o Medical Tent had 30-40 transports
- ▶ Consideration for possible upstaffing of Nursing, Social Work, and Security during peak hours and possibly nights after event closes?

Disaster/Inclement Weather Planning

Evacuation Plans in place; mirror plans for July 4th events

- ▶ Similar volume of patrons
- ▶ Provides for indoor spaces safe for patrons

If MCI occurs, NWC system and Region 9 plans will be activated
